Section 1: Annual Convention. FFMC shall hold an annual convention in the spring, to be hosted by the districts in rotation as specified in Section 3. The convention shall be held for the purpose......

Section 2: Annual Fall Session and Workshop. FFMC shall hold an annual fall session and workshop in September, to be hosted by the districts in rotation as specified in Section 3.

**Section 3:** The Annual Convention and the Annual Fall Session shall be hosted by the districts according to the following schedule, and this schedule shall be extended indefinitely to all future Conventions and Fall Sessions unless the Executive Committee, for reasons of an emergency nature, grants an exception. 2006-2010 Schedule (to be extended into the future)

## From the FFMC Junior Counselor — Michael Edwards

he Sixty-Ninth Annual FFMC Junior Convention was held May 5-6, 2006 at the University of North Florida. Thirteen Hundred and Fifty Juniors were registered in over 2,900 events. One hundred and eighty- nine teachers were represented at this Junior Convention. A big thank you to the Executive Director of UNF Fine Arts Center, Sharon Papion and her staff for helping to make this Junior Convention a first class event. A big thank you to Suzanne Carpenter and Kenny and Shirley Clark who worked tirelessly with your Junior Counselor organizing this event. Vickie Stake our facilities chairman, Vickie Stake, Suzanne Carpenter, Michael Edwards and Jennifer Bent for securing the judges, Gavin Taylor and Lisa Smith for securing the monitors, Catherine Gavin our Strings Chairman, and Helen B. Neidung our Voice Chairman. Also, a big thank you to our FFMC President Connie Tuttle-Lill who worked side by side with all of us during this event.

The seventieth Annual Junior Convention will be held May 4-5, 2007 at the University of North Florida. Recommendations for the 2008 Junior Convention facilities are being accepted for consideration. The facility must include an auditorium that will seat 1000 minimum and 12 audition rooms. These audition rooms should include at least three band-choral rooms to accommodate large numbers of participants. This facility must have access to piano companies to meet the needs of the event. The host district must organize a committee to secure judges, monitors and work with the host facility.

Please read the recommendations that were approved at the 2006 FFMC Spring Session. Several of the recommendations will affect the 2007 FFMC junior Convention. String teachers have received these recommendations from our Strings Chairman Catherine Gavin. In particular, the Patriotic Folk Event will become a piano solo event. Also, the Violin Concerto Event will have required violin solo correlations which will be as follows:

Primary IV through Elementary III Junior IA
Elementary II through Medium II Junior IB
Medium I through Difficult I Junior II
Medium III through Advanced I Junior III
Difficult II through Advanced II Senior
