We were pleased when a group from the Wednesday Morning Musicale from Wauchula attended.

The Tuesday Music Club had a successful Dinner Theater to raise monies for the scholarships given to high school seniors and college students who plan to pursue a career in music. Entertainment was provided by a Barbershop Chorus as well as the Broadway Chorus.

Believing firmly that music should be promoted and provided for all ages, the Tuesday Music Club is sponsoring The Broadway Chorus which is composed of Senior Citizens who love to sing and want to share that love. The group performs regularly in area nursing homes, assisted living residences as well as clubs. A number of the TMC members have joined the chorus to show support for this project. This has been a successful project for all concerned.

The Winter Haven, Lakeland, Tampa, and Lake Wales teachers have had their junior festivals.

Wauchula Wednesday Musicale and President James Stallings have definitely been busy. The 2014-2015 season has been one of marked membership increase and the hottest competition for scholarship dollars in the club's history, dating back to 1925! The programs for the year have been the most well-attended in the club's history! And the club has welcomed to its podium more local musicians and instrumentalists than ever before!

Two of the programs were held in the homes of members, and focused on "Music in the Home" and the annual Past President's Tea. Christmas festivities were taken to the county retirement center and over 45 members contributed songs, poetry and musicians bringing Christmas cheer to the seniors and their family. Band students from the local Junior High School also presented their Christmas musical cheer as a finale to the program.

Rounding out the programs for the year were the favorite "Men In Music", the annual Patriotic concert in November, and our special guests of brother and sister, Joshua and Andrea Guaita, presenting a 45-minute concert on cello, violin and piano.

Joy of Man's Desiring," Pachelbel's "Canon in D," Scott Joplin's "The Entertainer," Chopin's "Etude," "I Know Whom I Have Believed," "He Leadeth Me," "For The Beauty of the Earth," "Power in the Blood," "Blessed Assurance," and "The Way of the Cross."

Andrea, 13, is a violin/vocal soloist who currently sings with the Sarasota Young Voices where she sings either alto or soprano. She has played the violin for 6 ½ years and is a student of the Sarasota Music Academy. She plays in the Sarasota Youth Orchestra where she has been the concertmaster for the last three years.

Fifteen-year-old Joshua, a gifted athlete in addition to his musical talents, has played the piano for 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ years and the cello for 5 years. He plays the cello for the Sarasota Youth Orchestra for the Philharmonic Orchestra. He has won the Roger Roszell Music Scholarship for two consecutive years.

Musicale President James Stallings is happy that we have talent like the Guaitas in Florida and hopes to offer more concerts like this to encourage young gifted musicians and allow them to display their talents at as many forums as possible.

The 2014-2015 scrapbook has been completed and is ready for presentation to our executive board and to our membership. Our bylaws committee will be busy updating the bylaws. New officers will be in place by this summer, and the board will be making plans for the 2015-2016 club year. It should be outstanding!

Junior Festivals Information

FFMC Festivals Chair, Lisa Smith

As the 2015 district festival season comes to an end, anticipation grows for those juniors who have qualified to participate in State Junior Convention May 8-9 at the University of North Florida. The postmark deadline for applications is March 10, 2015, no exceptions. Applications can be obtained from ffmc-music.org. Please read and be familiar with the rules and guidelines in the Junior Division Procedures Manual that govern the State Junior Convention. Every new and renewing member of FFMC was sent an email containing this document last fall. If you are unable to locate the email, this document can be downloaded from the FFMC website under the Junior Festivals tab. It is important to note that although memorization is no longer required at area festivals for American Patriotic Folk Song event, it is STILL required at the FFMC State Junior Convention. If you have any questions about applications or guidelines, please feel free to contact me at lisa.ffmc.jrconvention@outlook.com.

Also, as of May 2014, the FFMC Board of Directors revised the rule requiring every participating festival area to provide workers to assist with monitoring duties at the Junior State Convention. The Junior Procedures Manual now states, "Each festival area having entries in the Junior State Convention will provide monitoring (minimum of half day for each worker) for each day of the competition as follows:

- ➤ Less than 3 participating teachers ½ a day
- → 4 7 participating teachers 1 full day
- ▶ 8 10 participating teachers 1½ day
- ➤ 11 20 participating teachers 2 full days
- ➤ 21 30 participating teachers 3 full days
- > 31 or more 5 full days

If not, they will make arrangement, including funding, to hire an individual to cover that responsibility. Names with contact information will be provided to the Monitor Chairman at least 14 days prior to the start of the convention." This rule has come to fruition because over the years it has become increasingly difficult for FFMC to obtain and secure willing volunteers to assist at the State Junior Convention. It is crucial that we have enough workers to help audit and monitor audition and practice rooms at the venue so that the event will run efficiently. Area Festival Chairmen, please start planning ahead now in terms of who will represent your area. I will let each area festival chairman know by email how many teachers have registered for State Junior Convention from his/her respective festival area once all applications have been received.
